Boatbuilding to Teach

The mission of the Capital Region Maritime Center, Inc. (CRMC) is to develop and offer programs, services and other activities for youth and the general population related to education, history, recreation, travel and tourism, ecological and natural sciences and maritime occupations.

The Maritime Center offers Boatbuilding to Teach programs for at-risk to advanced students, families, groups, organizations, and others. The Center teaches STEM subjects, especially math, through boatbuilding and more. The Center's program is currently undergoing revision and is expected to reopen in Spring 2014 based on the Alexandria Seaport Foundation's Building to Teach program. Two of the replica bateaux previously built at the Maritime Center (shown above) were donated to the Mabee Farm in Rotterdam Junction. The two bateaux - the "De Sager" and the "Bobbie G" - are docked there seasonally on the Mohawk River/Erie Canal. The bateaux have appeared in documentaries and films, including one on the Potomac River in Virginia for Greystone Films: George Washington, Man of Decision for the Mount Vernon Visitors Center. At the Maritime Center, students learn by doing, connect and achieve success!
